

Biographical Sketches

Keri O. Bennett, Au.D. is an Educational Audiologist at Multnomah ESD. In 2006, she was awarded her Doctorate of Audiology from the University of Washington. Post-graduation she became a research audiologist at the VA RR&D National Center for Rehabilitative Auditory Research and in 2009 added a clinical position at the Oregon Health and Science University (adult and pediatric populations). During that time she completed a certificate in Human Research Investigations at OHSU (2011). For over a decade she traversed both clinic and research including 12 publications and 24 presentations/talks, and most recently (2018) pursued educational audiology.

Frederick J. Gallun, Ph.D. is Associate Professor at Oregon Health and Science University and the VA Portland Health Care System. Since 2003, his laboratory and research collaborations have been continuously funded by competitive awards from the National Institutes of Health, NSF, and VA, as well as the European Union. He has published over 70 papers in the areas of psychoacoustics, speech perception, divided and selective attention, spatial hearing, and computational models of auditory processing. His current work involves translating laboratory tests of auditory processing into portable versions that can be used in clinical and educational settings.
